THE WRITING'S ON THE WALL ... AS YOU GO ...

This is who we are as a church. It's a way of life that anyone can pick up at any point, no matter what your age is or what your circumstances are. 'As you go' is for everyone, which is the way it should be – because we are all called to be the hands and feet of Jesus in our day-to-day lives. There's no denying though, that there's a special window of time between leaving school and diving headlong into the world of tertiary study, full-time work, living away from home for the first time, getting married, having kids etc...

Since we are an As You Go church, what better way to prepare young people for life after school than by giving them the opportunity of a 1-year internship within our local church and mission spaces? A year of being mentored in their faith while serving the church through ministry and impacting communities through mission.

The goal is to come alongside young people, invest in them at a critical stage in their development and show them how ministry, mission and the vocational calling on their lives need not be mutually exclusive, but rather that God can bring all these elements together for their good and for His purposes...

LifeHouse Care

LifeHouse Care is the community care arm of LifeHouse Church, working for the peace and wellbeing of our community – meeting people where they're at, expressing Jesus' love through helping, connecting and empowering individuals, families and communities.

We're all about locals helping locals, and collaboration is a key part of how we fulfil our mission. Our Op shops, Food Pantries and Crisis Care Team work in synergy to meet the needs of those doing it tough in our communities. Together with other local businesses, organisations, councils and service providers, we support people in taking their next steps with confidence, knowing that they are not alone.

Here are some favourite testimonies from the LifeHouse Care team in the last $12 \text{ months}\dots$

OP SHOPS


Working with Community Services (CS) and getting our Work for the Dole program up and running this year has had a massive impact. It's an answer to prayer because volunteer numbers are low, so having more hands on deck has been a huge help, and at the same time it's an extra way we can engage people from our community, to help the community.

The probation & parole team have mentioned that offenders who do CS in organisations like ours, have a high percentage of not reoffending. The process allows us to be a positive influence in CS workers' lives while also supporting them in taking a positive step forward in society. Meanwhile, Work for the Dole means that people who've struggled to find work can come and spend eight weeks developing essential work experience. Since the start of the year, three out of six who've come through have already gone on to get jobs straight after. Some of them have also been coming to church, which is fantastic.

CRISIS CARE

We offer critical assistance with food, furniture, clothing etc, but a lot of people are looking for connection as much as tangible items. So when they are open to being referred – whether it's to church or to volunteer in our Pantries or Op shops – it's always wonderful to find out later that they've found community, belonging and encouragement. So many parents are seeking positive influences and environments for their teenagers – so being able to let them know about our LifeHouse Youth Ministry is amazing.

It's also humbling when people say that by just listening and caring, we helped them to feel safe again. Recently there was a lady who, as an asylum seeker, had already faced huge challenges. Sadly, since she arrived in Australia she's gone through even more trauma, including a battle with cancer. She really struggled to open up, but during a follow-up call a couple of days after her appointment, she was so thankful for the service we provide and said it was one of the few times she felt she could push past her anxiety to talk to someone. She said it's given her the courage to come check out our Op Shops and Pantry to volunteer.





FOOD PANTRIES

There's a single dad who comes to one of our Pantries each week. He's so sensible with what he buys, making a small amount stretch to the end of the week, and he's also just calmly grateful each week. Some of the money he saves by shopping with us allows his kids to be able to do a sport – which is such a positive thing for their development and wellbeing, especially when other parts of life are really tough. Things like affordable groceries often make a much bigger impact than one would expect.

Our clientele has increased so much! 2022 was the biggest year we've ever had, and that equates to helping thousands of people along the coast. A major contributing factor is our relationships with other amazing organisations. When the floods hit Moree, for example, through a collaboration with Foodbank, semi-trailers full of water and emergency relief food packages were driven out to our Moree Pantry, where our local network mobilised into action – flying provisions out in helicopters or

AS YOU GO HEROES

Pam, Coffs Pantry volunteer

Walk into any of our LifeHouse Pantries, and you're bound to find a gem or two. Not just affordable food items, but something even more valuable... the volunteers who arrive with a smile, week after week, to serve their community – our community. Pam is one of those precious gems.

How did you get started in the Pantries?

"It all came about when we were picnicking with friends and needed a tablecloth, so I popped into the Bello op shop. At the back we saw this little pantry and Kellie was there. She explained how it all worked, and mentioned that they were opening up another pantry in Coffs the following week. This was perfect, since I'd already been looking for somewhere to volunteer. So it was all meant to be."

And you've brought friends along, haven't you?

"Yes there's Carol and Marcelle who lives round the corner... I knew Lynn would be great because she worked in finance and she's got a phenomenal memory for prices and things." (Lynn does a brilliant job as the Chief Procurement Officer for all our pantries sourcing produce from different suppliers and getting the best deals possible for our clients.)

"Then there's Barb..." (who, walking past calls out "I love it so much I'd come every day if I could!")

Any times you've been tempted to stop?

"No, never. I'm tired at the end of Tuesday, but I'm happy tired. I love this place and these people. When my husband died, this is what got me through, gave me something good to focus on. When you live in regional places you need to have community, and it's good to have a place for people to come and give without thinking, "What's in it for me?"



LifeWalk

In 2022 we kicked off LifeWalk – an annual fundraiser run by LifeHouse Care, to gather the wider Coffs community together to help homeless people and those at risk of becoming homeless.

Homelessness is a significant issue in this city, with over 700 people sleeping rough in our community every night. Our Crisis Care team works hard to offer what services we can in these situations – such as this one...


"We were engaged in helping a single mother with two kids who were living in a tent. She found accommodation and a job, which was fantastic – but the job didn't start until the week after they moved into their accommodation. Her Centrelink allowance covered the rent, but not food for her kids. So she anxiously reached out to us for food assistance. It was amazing to be able to help her with that – and encourage and celebrate her as a woman and a mum doing everything she could to provide for her family in an incredibly tough situation."

Unfortunately, there are too many other stories where people haven't been able to find shelter.

That's why in 2023 LifeWalk will raise funds to continue our crisis work and to bring a "sleepbus" to our area, giving rough sleepers a chance to get a proper night's rest, knowing that they are safe. This leads to improved mental health and a greater capacity to plan for their next steps.

It's not a long-term solution, but while we're working together on the bigger picture, a sleepbus IS an immediate answer to an urgent challenge. It's a step in the right direction. And that is what LifeWalk and LifeHouse Care is all about... meeting people where they are at and helping them with their next steps.





LifeHouse, we are called to plant big-spirited churches in small communities. Whether this is sparked by a concentrated area of existing believers or an opportunity that seems to come 'out of nowhere', we know that God works through us in this specific way. Coffs Harbour (well it was small when it started!)... Moree... Northern Beaches... Grafton... And now a new opportunity has opened up in beautiful Urunga!

We have the opportunity to rent a (currently unused) church building. How long for? We don't yet know beyond the next six months – but that's not our concern right now. Our responsibility right now is to walk through the door that has opened before us. And because we don't have all the resources required, we will be walking this journey by faith. In His wisdom, God often doesn't show us complete plans... He shows us next steps. And since we already have a connection in Urunga through our LifeHouse Care Pantry – it's so exciting to be able to take this next step of planting a church there too!

Open Doors in the Middle East

A CELEBRATION - OF THE CHURCH CARING FOR ITS OWN

Open Doors continues to partner with Centres of Hope across the Middle East – local churches offering practical and spiritual support to communities in strife-stricken areas. Established and effective mechanisms and networks enabled them to spring into action when the 2023 earthquakes hit Turkey and Svria.

According to workers on the ground, the type of assistance needed, is shifting. "We are now moving from immediate basic relief assistance – like emergency food and shelter – into restoring damaged homes. Our networks, together with support from the global church, are helping to rebuild around 2,600 homes, representing over 10,000 people." – Leyla*, local partner. Knowing the importance of restoring people as well as buildings, trauma care is another way that the Centres are helping Syrians to recover.

STANDING IN THE GAP

The work isn't limited to disaster relief though. Centres of Hope in Syria were providing aid, spiritual discipleship, persecution-preparedness and Bibles long before the earthquakes hit.

Christians living in this region face what Leyla calls "an existential battle" – where to be Christian is to risk being denied the rights of Syrian citizens and excluded from (government-directed) international assistance. People talk about 'qualitative privilege' – a state in which Christians may well be educated, but they often can't get a job. They love their country and want to stay, but cannot feed their families and so they have to leave. In 10 years the Christian population in Aleppo has fallen from 200,000 to 30,000. This is why support from the global church is imperative.

MOVING FORWARD

The long-term plan is to keep building capacity through Centres of Hope (currently numbering 287 in the wider region) to be able to serve the 50,000 Christian families throughout Syria.

New Life Fellowship, Cambodia

What beats a good God connection? Two of them.

CELEBRATIONS

When some of the LifeHouse mission team visited Cambodia last year, there was an immediate heart connection with New Life Fellowship Church (NLF). With mission statements that are practically interchangeable – right down to our church community outreach arms (LifeHouse Care and New Life Foundation are like twins separated at birth), we knew we had found a sister church, so we were ready and raring to go to support our Cambodian family.

CHALLENGES

Every adventure has its detours and delays. In this case it was the laser-beam field of red tape to be navigated in order to comply with government requirements for sending funds to overseas charities. (Not scintillating stuff, but imperative nonetheless.) BUT GOD is faithful to His promise to equip us with all we need for doing His will. So when Chad Irons (General Manager of ACCI for the last 12 years) 'just happened' to be passing through Coffs with his wife Corrie, shortly before heading off to become ACCI Field Workers – in Cambodia! – we knew God had just handed us a victory, in the form of a thoroughly qualified consultant and on-the-ground cultural liaison team.

COMING SOON

With all dots properly joined, we're delighted to report that we are officially supporting two of NLF's church plants – Suong City and Steung Sen City. We can't wait to update you as this picture unfolds in the coming months...

Mother's Heart, Cambodia

CELEBRATIONS

What started as a side-visit during the mission team's trip to Cambodia turned out to be yet another divinely directed connection. Mother's Heart is the first, and currently only, crisis pregnancy centre in Cambodia – where 1 in 5 women go through unplanned pregnancies.

Mother's Heart exists to empower, equip and educate women and their families through counselling, support services, medical care and community involvement so they can choose the best future for themselves and their babies. Last year, 76 women and girls and 67 babies were nurtured and supported through Mother's Heart Crisis Pregnancy Counselling and Pregnancy Support programs, while 17 children attended their daycare centre.

CHALLENGES

In Cambodia, being a single mother is a quick way to poverty and brings social shame. The financial burden and loss of reputation leads to women feeling overwhelmed, isolated, and like they have no choice but to abort, traffick or abandon their babies – or even take their own lives. Mother's Heart was birthed in response to the absence of any kind of emotional, medical or social support available to these women and girls.

THE PATH AHEAD

Mother's Heart has developed a program that is at the forefront of preventing child-family separation and supporting women with unplanned or unwanted pregnancies. They proactively support expectant mums and their families through crisis pregnancies, and ensure that every child of a single mother in their pregnancy support program is either raised by his or her mother, extended family or is placed in permanent foster care.



COMPASSION + CONNECTION + COMMUNITY.

That's the heart behind Care for the Carers – providing our incredible foster care families with a chaplain to lead this space and coordinate care packages and helping hands.

Often carers are given very little notice before a new child is placed with them, and the reality of these situations is that the children have suffered significant trauma. So having the support of a church community who can mobilize quickly to provide practical support allows foster carers to focus on what only they can do... Together, this helps to create a stable & reassuring transition for the children coming into care and for the carers who are opening their hearts and homes. One of our foster carers said "I don't know how I would have got through the transition without the support of Barb and the church. The support was there before I even realized that I needed it. They were such a blessing."

Lilyrose

The Lilyrose Antenatal Clinic is a volunteer-run service providing supportive medical care to pregnant women, their partners and families. Medical Director and GP-Obstetrician, Dr Deirdre Little, provides the opportunity for mums and dads to view their baby on the ultrasound monitor and all women are bulk-billed.

The Lilyrose Pregnancy Support arm is available by phone 24/7, and the team are ready to bless any expectant mum with:

- a place where they can be heard, understood, validated and encouraged
 whether the pregnancy is planned or unplanned
- · unconditional care and respect
- · the opportunity to ask questions and be fully informed about their options
- generously donated baby items and other forms of practical and emotional support
- a safe space for those who have made, or been affected by, decisions
 that have left them with pain and regret. Compassionate, nonjudgmental support can help mums and dads find healing, peace and
 freedom from the past.

It's a huge job, which affects the lives of many every day – and the team is quick to give all glory to God. "This ministry was birthed through the Holy Spirit. It's God who has kept us going, making the way for miracles and enabling us to encourage and equip women in their journey through pregnancy. It's His work, which He accomplishes through ordinary people."

An example of this is when Lilyrose Coordinator and RN, Judy Alcock, was on holiday in the Northern Territory last year and was prompted to pray for the isolated communities in that region. Meanwhile (unbeknownst to Judy), through Dr Deirdre's research and connections with the Catholic Medical Association, came an invitation for Judy and Dr Deirdre to attend a conference in Darwin, where they were asked to share how Lilyrose was set up. As well as providing insight gained over many years of experience, the team were delighted to donate an ultrasound machine in support of a new clinic being established in Darwin. Queanbeyan is another location where God has blessed Lilyrose to be a blessing to others by donating an ultrasound for more pregnant women to be able to see their babies on screen.

Prison Chaplaincy

SURPRISING CELEBRATIONS...


When the chaplaincy team at Clarence Correctional Centre started showing *The Chosen* TV series, they explained that viewings would stretch across 18 months – to which one inmate enthusiastically exclaimed, "That's good, I'll still be here to see the end of the series!"

While there's a touching sense of humour in there, it's also a sobering reminder of how hard it must be to instil hope and keep it aflame in those facing years in prison.

STANDING IN THE GAP

Thankfully, chaplains like Peter Ainsworth head to prison week after week, because they know that God doesn't give up on anyone – no matter how long they're in for, or why. Matthew 25:36–40 doesn't give qualifications of which people to visit in prison. Jesus doesn't say to visit oppressed believers who've been unfairly imprisoned under anti-Christain regimes. He simply says to visit those in prison – 'the least of these' – not referring to their worth in His eyes (which is priceless) but their status in society. He says they are His brothers and sisters... which means they are ours, too.

He knows the plans He has for them – plans to give them a hope and a future... a revelation given to the prophet Jeremiah (who knew a thing or two about being in prison). To this end, the chaplaincy team is helping to facilitate Kairos – a week-long discipleship program which is due to run in the centre in June. This national ministry has been shown to change the culture of jails and is run both inside for inmates and outside for their partners, strengthening the chance for longterm transformation.

Police Chaplaincy

STARTING EACH DAY WITH PRAYER

"God, I pray for divine appointments – doors of opportunity that I could never open myself. Give me ears to hear clearly, a heart to love well and the wisdom to speak Your words alone, into today's situations."

This intentional prayer is how every day starts for Police Chaplain Ps Greg Holder.

And every day, God faithfully honours that prayer.

In every sector, awareness of the presence and benefit of chaplaincy is a huge part of the solution – and God is supernaturally opening doors of awareness to different parts of the police force. From forensics to radio control to police on the beat – the growing awareness of chaplaincy is an integral link to sanity and normality in an insane and abnormal environment.

FIRM FOUNDATIONS

On any given day, police chaplains are exposed to such a wide range of scenarios that one simply cannot be prepared for. Their response is to approach each day standing firm on a foundation of prayer. Recently, Ps Greg has gone from a baby dedication for a police family, to a flag raising ceremony with 8 different indigenous tribal groups to helping police deal with a triple fatality which involved children.

Add to all this the 14 or so 1:1 sessions that are typical in a police chaplain's week, and it's easy to see how vital these men and women are, who devotedly serve those who serve us every day – even when we're unaware of it.

Doing the math...

Only half of Australians consider Jesus to have been an actual person in history – despite the overwhelming evidence of His existence on earth as accepted by academics (both Christian and secular) the world over. Nevermind the fact that only two in ten consider Jesus to be divine, according to a 2022 National Church Life Survey.

Our country is undergoing a rapidly widening knowledge gap (let alone the faith gap) about Jesus and the Christian faith... and that's just among adults surveyed.

Can you imagine how this gap is increasing for our nation's children?

Meanwhile, according to a 2015 study by the Mental Health Commission of NSW, "of the one million or so school-aged children in NSW, about 100,000 will face mental health challenges such as disruptive behaviour, anxiety and depression". In the last few years that number has risen to one in seven Australian children and adolescents aged 4 to 17 experiencing a mental health disorder.

Praise God that as a church, we get to bring the light and hope of Jesus into this space, by supporting the amazing men and women who step into schools every week. Ministry in state schools doesn't look like someone preaching an evangelistic sermon at an assembly. It's much more relational than that. It's often through meeting a student or staff member at their point of need, that a school worker will have the opportunity to show the love, grace and acceptance of Jesus.

SCHOOL CHAPLAINCY

Within school communities across the nation, school chaplains are regarded as integral contributors to the wellbeing of students and the broader school community by providing guidance, mentoring and support; helping to develop healthy relationships; building confidence, resilience and self-esteem. Principals and parents, staff and students alike are noticing the profound changes that the presence of a school chaplain makes through programs such as: breakfast clubs improving concentration in class; chaplain-led lunchtime activities helping diffuse schoolyard tensions; and 1:1 sessions with someone students can trust, who is not a teacher or parent.

SRE

SRE is another opportunity we have for speaking life to children in NSW schools where, thankfully, it is currently part of the curriculum. Parents can opt their children into SRE classes where they are introduced to the God of the Bible. Many of these children have never been to church, so finding out that "God loves me and He can help me love others too," is altogether new. Scripture class participants have so much fun through passionate Scripture teachers and fantastic resources, that other students ask their parents to opt them in out of sheer curiosity!

As a church, we support SRE in areas local to each of our campuses. Through our Grafton connections alone, we are able to support teachers in:

- 3 high schools reaching around 400 students and...
- 12 primary schools reaching around 740 students!

LOVE OUT LOUD

One SRE resource provider is our very own Love Out Loud team. It's fantastic that LOL has been authorised for use in Scripture classes throughout NSW, and through the infectious enthusiasm of children, LOL is having an impact in homes too, as it becomes a kickstarter for conversations among families. Plans are in motion to see LOL crossing both borders (to become part of the curriculum in QLD) and oceans – where conversations are happening with influencers in India, the UK and the US. This unfolding story is a great example of God working through willing hearts to open doors far and wide. It's evident to see His favour all over this mission.

In its first five years, the Moree Deadly Diamonds youth leadership and discipleship program has sown into 55 teenagers – fostering long term personal transformation and cultivating a heart for leading others by serving them.

STANDING IN THE GAP

It takes time and consistency to build up young people – many of whom have gone through enormous hardship without having someone to point them in a positive direction for their futures. The dedicated leaders provide caring personal mentorship, a safe & encouraging space to learn and grow, and opportunities to serve 50-75 younger children each week at Kids Club.

BREAKING NEW GROUND

Mentors are seeing hard ground being broken before their eyes, as more and more Diamonds say that God is becoming more than a nice idea – He's becoming real to them. One young man who'd been through the program got back in touch with his mentor when he unwittingly found himself in legal and financial trouble. Because of the trust built up and the godly influence he experienced during his years in Deadly Diamonds, he felt God prompting him to ask for help instead of getting into a deeper hole by trying to sort it out alone. These Diamonds are experiencing God's transformative power at work in their lives as they hear His word and trust in His love for them – "You guide me with your counsel, leading me to a glorious destiny." (Psalm 73:24)

Woolgoolga Community Cafe (WCC) is back in full swing, gathering 30-40 regular diners for a delicious, nutritious meal each Wednesday evening at our LifeHouse Northern Beaches campus. In fruit season, the cafe bursts at the seams with additional backpackers and berry-pickers from across the globe. It's a truly beautiful representation of a service run by the community, for the community.

STANDING IN THE GAP

The cafe is an open door to all – including the hungry and homeless but also those suffering another kind of hunger... for connection.

A handful of faithful volunteers (affectionately nicknamed "God's Angels" by the diners), provide so much more than food: they are growing friendships and family. One young couple who followed up the fruit season with a trip across Australia said upon their return, "it was like coming home to our Aussie Family" – a sentiment expressed by many foreign visitors. Longstanding locals have also found recognition and a sense of belonging at the cafe. One guest who is sadly disappearing into dementia, feels so valuable when he helps stack the chairs at the end of the evening. He attends with absolute delight each week, and his wife is ever grateful for this opportunity which brings structure and meaning to his world.

MOVING FORWARD

This year, WCC has extended its arm further into the community, providing surplus meals and bread (donated by a local bakery) to families attending the Kids & Cuppa group – which sees 30 unchurched families meeting each week. This combined gift of an encouraging environment and a healthy meal to take home is a real blessing – especially to new mums.

This is all Jesus, working through His people, to look after His people.

Rape, torture and murder are commonplace. Human Rights groups call it a policy of slow genocide.

LIGHTING THE WAY

Mandate Ministries are doing all that they can to be a torch of hope in this dark territory where 95% of the people do not yet know the light and love of Jesus. So far, over 60 refugee families have been supplied with essential provisions and together with local churches they are planning small concerts at Karen villages to bring some joy in the midst of so much pain.


